

## 4 The number of visitors came up to 112,752

#### ☐ For the protection of the rights of persons with disabilities and promotion of their further participation in society

~ Normalization in the past, present and future

In Japan, movements towards the protection of the rights and dignity of persons with disabilities and the promotion of their independence and participation in the civil and social spheres are developing in many ways, for example, an establishment of "Act to eliminate discrimination on the basis of disability" or an amended "Act to promote the employment of persons with disabilities" -both are a response to the ratification of "Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2014)" and were effective in April 2016 - as well as the staging of 2020 Tokyo Paralympics.

At the H.C.R. Symposium this year, we invited a specialist from Denmark, where the

principle of "Normalization" was born, and studied about the protection and promotion of the rights of persons with disabilities and their social participation in Europe in the past 10 years and in future then considered the Japanese measurements in the future.

The number of the participants was 253.
